NOTE: Every competitor must present their MNZ Club membership affiliation card - otherwise you will be required to join the Canterbury Mini MX Club at the event.

An entry list is available at timingtech.co.nz along with results after the event. The Speedhive app & Race-Monitor app has results and live timing where coverage is available. Attached is proposed race order and start times. The aim is to have 3 rounds of racing.

TRACK/PIT RULES

NO DOGS

NO TEAR OFFS ALLOWED

ENSURE YOUR CHILD RIDES THEIR BIKE AT WALKING PACE WITHIN THE PIT AREA & TO/FROM START GATES

All bikes must be numbered so that easily identifiable for Officials' & Flag Marshall's.

Please ensure you go out in the correct practice/race and if your race is split start ensure you start with the correct group.

TAG Coffee & Club BBQ & pies will be available to purchase onsite so bring along some cash.

Camping allowed - \$20 per family per night to be paid at sign in please.

PLEASE TAKE YOUR RUBBISH HOME WITH YOU.

If you have been injured or referred for follow up treatment at an event you will be listed on the MNZ restricted riders list & will require a Medical Clearance before you are eligible to compete again – any queries relating to this please contact the MNZ office.

SIGN IN

Sunday sign in: 7.15am-8.00am

– For those needing a One Event Licence, please complete the paperwork for this before signing in and getting a transponder (separate que).

All competitors including those purchasing a One Event Licence must present their club membership card (must be a MNZ affiliated club or join the club at the sign in.

Riders competing on a One Event Licence are required to have their bike checked over prior to practice.

Sunday Riders Briefing at: 8.15am in your gear

HELMETS – You need to take your helmet/(s) along to sign in.

We don't want to turn anyone away on the day, so please check in advance that your helmet meets current MNZ regulations.

As of 31st December 2019 the Snell approval code M2010 can no longer be accepted (also not accepted are M2000 & M2005).

Helmet standards are found either on a label on the chin strap, a sticker inside the lining of the helmet, or on the outside rear helmet at the base.

An example of what the Helmet Standards look like is provided at the end of these regulations.

Note: Rule 8.2n: 'Helmet Cameras or other accessories are not permitted to be attached to the rider's Helmet'. (This includes Camera Mounts)

Body Armour – Body Armour that includes back protection must be worn and will be checked on the day.

If caught without body armour you will not be able to compete.

Our Officials & Organisers are all volunteers without whom this and other events couldn't happen, they don't set the regulations but are required to enforce them.
