This event is being run under Covid-19 Level 2 restrictions, please read important information below relating to this event.

The club have been extremely proactive to enable this event to continue under Level 2 Covid-19 restrictions, using the requirements and guidelines provided by MNZ, Sport New Zealand, Worksafe and the NZ Government. All competitors and their crew must abide by these guidelines at all times – failure to do so will mean you will be asked to leave the event. Please respect the Covid-19 regulations to keep yourself and everyone attending this event safe & healthy. COVID-19 LEVEL 2 REQUIREMENTS & GUIDELINES

Main points to note are:

- **If you or a member of your household are unwell, please do NOT attend the event and follow Government recommendations around getting tested and isolating.**
- **Strict gate opening hours are in place. Please respect these.**
- **Gates are closed until 4.30pm Friday 17th September** to everyone except personnel involved in the organisation/running of the event.

The gate will be closed at 7.30pm Friday 17th September.

Saturday – Gates open to competitors from 6.00am. Sunday – Gates open at 7.00am to competitors and will be closed on Saturday 18th at 5.00pm.

Access outside these hours is only available for personnel involved in the running of the event (to scan in on entry) and by prior arrangement.

- Everyone must complete contact tracing coming into the event – please help speed this process up by having the QR App on your phone (one scan per family/residence within each vehicle), there will be plenty of QR codes spread around the event and we do encourage everyone with the QR App on their phone to scan once inside the event area. You will need to scan each time you enter the event venue. Please ensure Bluetooth is activated on your phone, this helps keep track of people you've been near.
- No spectators, although not limited to a specific number you are asked to minimize pit crew attending where possible.
- Spread out around the pit area and practice social distancing (minimum 2m) from other rider's pits.
- **Remember your Face Mask.** Face Masks are strongly recommended except for competitors while racing. **Face Masks are compulsory at sign in & in the start area.** If for any reason a briefing is needed the loudspeaker will be used and you are asked to attend wearing a Face Mask. Please ensure you practice social distancing (2m separation) with others when outside your pit.
- **A written riders briefing is attached (no briefing at the event is scheduled), it is compulsory for you to read and agree to abide by this.** If you have any questions you are asked to direct these to the club via email secretary@chch.nz by 7pm on Wednesday 15th September 2021. A rider's rep for each track has been nominated, if you have any objection to the person nominated you are required to contact the club via email secretary@chchmx.nz by 7pm Wednesday 15th September 2021. Each morning from 7.30-7.45am Club Officials will be available at the sign in area for you to approach with anything that has arisen and you feel needs discussed. A loud speaker will be used for communication at the event.

TRACK/PIT RULES

NO DOGS – NO TEAR OFF'S - NO PIT BIKES – NO EXCEPTIONS

No pushbikes/pit bikes permitted around or within track area. All bikes must be numbered so that they are easily identifiable for Officials' & Flag Marshall's. Please ensure you go out in the correct practice/race and if your race is split start ensure you start with the correct group. A big thanks to the Stackhouse's for the use of their property, please respect this and ensure you take your rubbish home. Hot food, ice cream & coffee van onsite so bring along some cash.

NO PITTING BEFORE 4.30PM FRIDAY

Please keep clear of lanes/access roads which have been bunted off & also areas bunted off for major sponsors (these will be clearly marked). Lots of space for pitting in the rest of the paddock – please ensure 2m distancing between pits.

SIGN IN

FACEMASK & SOCIAL DISTANCING IS COMPULSORY

Friday at the track 5.00pm – 6.30pm (appreciate as many as possible attending this to speed up Saturday morning), **6.30am – 7.30am – Saturday** at the track. Please ensure that your MNZ log book is completed, with current helmet details in the front section & current Club membership card easily visible. For those that require a One Event Licence you will need to complete the paperwork for this (separate que at sign on) before signing in and collecting your transponder. **Everyone (including those purchasing a One Event Licence) must produce a current club membership card at sign in (MNZ affiliated club). If not a current member/ or can't find your membership card please sort that this week. Check your MNZ licence is still current as these now have rolling expiry dates.**

PRIZEGIVING

Sorry but with Level 2 requirements no formal prize giving will be able to be held. Trophies will be available to be collected from the sign in area 30 minutes after the overall event results are posted on the results board for after the last race on each track.

HELMETS – You need to take your helmet(s) along to sign in. We don't want to turn anyone away on the day, so please check in advance that your helmet meets current MNZ regulations. As of 31st December 2019, the Snell approval code of M2000, M2005 & M2010 can no longer be accepted. Helmet standards are found either on a label on the chin strap, a sticker inside the lining of the helmet, or on the outside rear helmet at the base. Please ensure you have the correct safety gear; regulations around Safety Gear can be found the following link at: <https://mnz.co.nz/wp-content/uploads/2021/07/Chapter-8-Safety-Gear-Off-Road.pdf> An example of what the Helmet Standards look like is provided at the end of these regulations. **Note: Rule 8.2n:** 'Helmet Cameras or other accessories are not permitted to be attached to the rider's Helmet'. (This includes Camera Mounts) **Body Armour** – Body Armour that includes back protection must be worn and will be checked on the day.

Our Officials & Organisers are all volunteers without whom this event couldn't happen, they don't set the regulations but they are required to enforce them.
